

## Global Compact Network Australia: 2020 Membership Benefits – Parent Organisations

Business signatories to the UN Global Compact can choose between two tiers of engagement: [Signatory or Participant](#). The financial contribution is based on the tier chosen and the business' annual revenue.

- For businesses with an annual revenue over US\$50m ('Corporate') the financial contribution to join the UN Global Compact **includes** GCNA membership.
- For businesses with an annual revenue less than US\$50m ('SME') and non-business organisations there is a voluntary financial contribution to join the UN Global Compact. A financial contribution is, however, payable to join the GCNA.

The benefits of joining the Global Compact Network Australia in 2020 are set out below. There are separate benefits and fees for subsidiary companies.

For all SME Signatories and non-business organisations, the GCNA will receive 100% of the contributions. GST is applicable to the Australian component of the fee.
