The directors present their report on Global Compact Network Australia Limited for the financial year ended 30 June 2020.

#### General information

### Principal activities

The principal activity of Global Compact Network Australia Limited during the financial year was providing a platform through which companies can build capacity around corporate sustainability, implementing the principles of the UN Global Compact in the area of human rights, labour, the environment and anti-corruption and contributing to the sustainable development goals.

The following significant changes in the operations occurred during the financial year:

- The announcement by the World Health Organisation regarding to the global pandemic outbreak of COVID-19 and the response of the Australian government may materially affect the operations of the organisation in future financial periods.
- The Organisation has received stimulus measures available during the COVID-19 pandemic. The board is of the opinion the Organisation is eligible for the measures on the basis it has satisfied the eligibility requirements.

#### Operating results

The profit of the organisation amounted to \$71,025 (2019: \$297,290).

# Notes to the Financial Statements

# For the Year Ended 30 June 2020

The financial report covers Global Compact Network Australia Limited as an individual entity. Global Compact Network Australia Limited is a not-for-profit Organisation limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The functional and presentation currency of Global Compact Network Australia Limited is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

#### 1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The financial report covers Global Compact Network Australia Limited as an individual entity. Global Compact Network Australia Limited is a Organisation limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The functional and presentation currency of Global Compact Network Australia Limited is Australian dollars.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified.

# 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Organisation and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

### **Grant revenue**

Grant revenue is recognised at fair value where there is reasonable assurance that the grant conditions will be met. Grants relating to expense items are recognised as income over the periods necessary to match the grant to the costs they are compensating.

#### Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

#### Subscriptions

Revenue from the provision of membership subscriptions is recognised on a straight line basis over the financial year.

## 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Revenue and other income

### Membership income

Membership income is recognised on a straight line basis over the financial year.

#### (b) Income Tax

The Organisation is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

The organisation was registered with the Australian Charities & Not For Profit Commission on the 1 July 2019 and obtained an exemption from Income Tax.

# (c) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

# (d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

# (e) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Organisation's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.
