The sports sector has experienced significant transformations in recent decades

Trends in Transformation


Rapid globalization, increased funding at elite levels, and technological advancements, including sports betting, have transformed the playing, organization, and consumption of sports.

The surge in sports commercialization has led to a significant increase in organized crime infiltrating sports organizations and engaging in corruption.

These changes have impacted major sports events, evidenced by scandals involving corrupt practices.

Threats to the major sport events



Four distinct stages can be identified:

- 1. Conceptualization
- 2. Planning and implementation
- 3. Legacy ownership transfer
- 4. Post-event operations and governance

Each stage faces specific corruption risks.

Recommendations for WC26 and LA28

Five key focus areas were identified to support safeguarding

these major sport events:

- **1. Legal and Regulatory Frameworks:** Update and strengthen laws to combat corruption and related crimes in sports.
- **2.** Coordination and Cooperation: Improve collaboration among criminal justice authorities, sports organizations, and other stakeholders.
- **3.** Corruption Prevention Strategies: Develop comprehensive anti-corruption policies tailored to these major events.
- **4. Reporting and Detection Mechanisms:** Strengthen and optimize systems for reporting and detecting corruption.
- **5.** *Investigation and Prosecution:* Build capacity for effectively investigating and prosecuting sports-related corruption cases.
